Dutch children temporarily living overseas with their parents want to make the smoothest possible transition into the education system on their return to The Netherlands or Belgium.

Dutch parents who decide to live abroad for a brief or extended period of time usually take their children with them.

Many parents would like their children to receive a Dutch education during this time abroad.

There are currently more than 180 Dutch schools and educational facilities worldwide.

These have been set up by Dutch individuals or Dutch companies and organizations.



TEACHING DUTCH LANGUAGE AND CULTURE

(120 HOURS IN A SCHOOL YEAR)

One of these Dutch schools "De Trekvogel" is since 14 January 2009 located in AISB. Jan Struys, the Dutch teacher-director, started the school together with a board of parents with 22 children from Tuesday until Friday from 15:00 - 17:45.

Now, on 14 January 2019, 10 years later, the Dutch school has 39 children from Monday until Friday and is exclusive in AISB.

Nowadays parents more frequently opt for Dutch language and culture classes instead of a full Dutch primary school curriculum.

These lessons, often both primary and secondary education, are meant for Dutch children attending a local or international education program.

By attending these Dutch classes, children will be prevented from falling behind in their native language when returning to The Netherlands or Belgium.

As the Dutch school we would like to thank AISB for being our host for 10 years and more to come.
